**BY TRANSFER FROM
ANOTHER UNITED
METHODIST CHURCH**

Simply mark the pew card "Wish to Join" column. A minister will then get in touch with you. Or you may ask, "Please write for my letter." A staff member of Wesley Church will handle the details of transfer for you.

**BY TRANSFER FROM
ANOTHER CHRISTIAN
DENOMINATION**

The process is very much like the one above. Since you are already baptized and confirmed, these steps will **not** be repeated. You will be asked to take the one vow taken by all members of the United Methodist Church: **"Will you be loyal to the United Methodist Church and uphold it by your prayers, your presence, your gifts, and your service?"**
